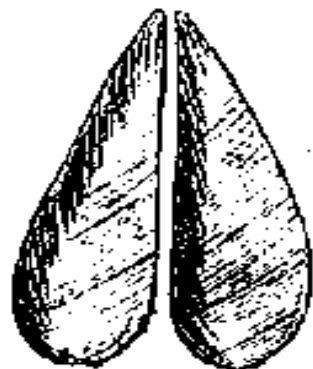

In the spring a buck's horns grow with a fuzzy covering that circulates blood to the developing horns called velvet. When the horns are finished growing the bucks rub off the velvet on trees.
